2006 Pulitzer Prize-winning historian David Oshinsky, PhD, describes in his most recent book the gripping story of polio, its enormous impact on American society in the 20th century and the intense effort to find a vaccine. Although a relatively uncommon disease, polio had neither a prevention nor a cure, and children were its prime victims. As a result, it was the most feared disease in mid-century America.
